

## Here's a simple craft idea to let the love flow. It's a fitting one for Valentine's Day, but there's no restrictions here. Twig hearts are delightful anytime of the year!

- 1. Collect a handful of twigs long enough to form the size heart you want (I used silver birch twigs between 12-24 inches long. I like their purple tinge and they're nice and flexible).
- 2. Divide your bundle of twigs into two even sized bunches.
- **3.** Secure the thicker ends of your two bunches together (I used a rubber band initially which made for easier adjustment than tying with string).
- **4.** If your two bunches have now become one bundle again, separate them at the top.
- **5.** Gently bend the two halves away from each other and down until they come together to form the bottom of your heart shape.
- **6.** Grasp them securely in one hand. (Warning: the twigs like to fling out in various directions at this stage so don't hold it too closely to any faces! Unless you want to turn it into a twig slapping game... that could be fun. But please, just risk assess it first!;)
- 7-8. Secure the bottom of your twig heart with string.
- **9.** Trim off any stray twigs with secateurs for a neater look. Equally, feel free to go for a wild and unruly look if that suits your fancy instead!
- **10.** If you used a rubber band in step 3, you could wrap string around it to cover it.
- **11.** Use any spare length of string to form a loop so your twig heart can hang somewhere on display!
- **12.** Optional: Give your twig heart to someone on Valentines day. A bundle of twigs shows love just as well as a box of chocolates, right?
